A Note from the Desk of Major Brandi LeDrew

Since moving to Ottawa, we have learned some new sounds. You see, back in Newfoundland, we didn't have crickets

and we didn't have cicadas and many other things. So we are constantly listening to our surroundings and right now everything is new. I'm sure you probably don't even hear these sounds anymore or if you do, don't give them a second thought. But listening is actually scriptural.

In 1 Samuel chapter 3, we find the story of Samuel as a young boy. We know his story, his mom Hannah wanted a baby so badly that she promised God that if he would bless her with a child, she would give him to the temple to serve. So here is Samuel, living in the temple, serving Eli (the high priest). One night in the quietness of the temple, Samuel hears his name, goes to Eli and asks what he needed. This happened 3 times before Eli realized that it was God speaking to the young boy. He then told him to go back and lie down and if he heard it again, to say, "Speak Lord, your child is listening." He did and God revealed many things to Samuel.

How about you, are you good at listening? Do you take time to notice your surroundings? How about in your spiritual life? Do you take time not only to pray and ask God for your wants and needs, but are you slowing yourself down long enough to hear his voice?

Epictetus (a Greek philosopher) once said that "we have two ears and one mouth so we can listen twice as much as we speak." What if we took that advice and applied it to our spiritual lives? What changes would we see? Would we be able to hear God's voice more clearly, would we be open to hearing the call of help from so many around us? What changes would be made inside our church?

Let's all take Samuel as an example and listen attentively for the voice of God. You may hear Him in many ways, through another person, through music, nature, prayer and Bible study. It truly doesn't matter how you hear his voice, only that you take time to listen as He speaks, and He will.

MESSAGE FROM THE WORD - God Keep Our Land

Major Bert opened by observing that we in Canada have so much for which to be thankful and to celebrate. He directed us to the beginnings of Canada when the Fathers of Confederation decided on the title of *Dominion of* Canada for our country based on Psalm 72. Major Sharp then listed many examples of Scripture verses engraved throughout the Parliament Buildings which acknowledges the key principles and priority issues of governing our county are spiritual. Bert's list of Scriptures in the seat of government were moving. He concluded with the inscription on the largest bell in the Peace Tower – *Glory to God in the Highest and on the Earth, peace and good will ...*

On this Canada Day, what is God's Word saying to us as a nation on this 155th anniversary? More personally, God is calling *you* to worship Him. Worship brings us joy and peace but it is not a *once a week* thing. Rather, worship is an encounter – a relationship with God – a call to righteousness. Each of us needs God in our lives to address our sins and shortcomings. We need to seek God's will for us and put our trust in Him. God cares so much for each of us. It is *not my will, Father, but yours*. Bert concluded his Message with the singing of *I Surrender All*.

Trinette shared three examples of the life-changing positive power of God in our lives: First, a man in Holland who appeared terribly sad and angry who eventually brought his sorrow to the Mercy Seat where the Holy Spirit brought peace; Second, Trinette shared the

story of when she was a young Corps Officer, a young woman who came into the Corps. The lady was heart-broken because she had lost her three year-old son when he wandered out onto the street and was killed by a street car. She too went to the Mercy Seat where the lord created a new, joyful worker in that Toronto Corps. A work of healing and peace was done. (Romans 8: 35-37)

The third example that Trinette Goddard shared occurred recently when she was called to the hospital as her daughter, Cathy, was emerging from many hours of anesthetic from surgery on her leg. They shared prayers once Cathy was able to comprehend what was happening. Later on, a young woman was brought into the bed next to Cathy and they bonded. Not long after, the team of doctors met with that lady and brought the news that her leg would have to be amputated. After the doctors left, Trinette went in to comfort her. While she stood holding the lady's hand, Cathy pushed back the curtain and sang Lord send your angels to watch over me, I'm so afraid of the dark... Although the lady still lost her leg, the comfort and strength of the Holy Spirit and the fellowship of a Christian friend helped carry her through. The message for each of us is expressed in the prayer song we sang with piano accompaniment Ask the Saviour to help you ... no matter with what challenges life confronts us, our Saviour will help us and bring comfort. Trinette closed in prayer and led the prayer song, He Giveth More Grace ...

BUILDING ISSUES

The Ottawa Citadel Building Advisory Committee (BAC) has continued to work behind the scenes throughout the summer and this is particularly true of CSM Linda Colwell who is presently acting as chair. There are a few matters that we should share with everyone at this time:

- 1. Snow Removal Contract (although we don't like to think about the "S" word at this time of year), it is nonetheless important that we plan for winter needs ahead of time. Therefore, it is good to announce that we have contracted with Franick Snow Removal for prices similar to last winter.
- 2. The contract with the French Catholic School Board has been finalized for the next two years for ten staff parking spaces in the Ottawa Citadel parking lot during the school year except when large events are being held at the Corps. (e.g. funerals, training events, etc.)
- 3. Installation of the window units remaining to complete the renewal of all the windows in the Officers' Quarters will take place on August 31st.
- 4. An agreement is now in place with the neighbour living in the house on the south side of the Quarters concerning delaying work to replace the shared fence which David Holland had to remove due to the hazardous condition of that wooden fence. Contract bids will be sought in September and October to complete the replacement in the spring.
- 5. The newly replaced roofing at the Corps and at the Officers' Quarters are working well. The roofer was called back to investigate problems in the General Office and the Family Services area. This may be the result of inadequate drains as both issues came up during the heavy rain storms we had in late July and early August.

A word of commendation is due David Holland who has gone beyond the call of duty in responding to problems in our properties. Our Corps Sergeant-Major is recognized as well for her additional efforts in providing leadership for the BAC in recent months.

MESSAGE: Spiritual Renewal

Jorden opened by drawing a parallel between Kathy and his recent renewal of their wedding vows and our need for a spiritual rest and recharging because we can become weary and complacent in our faith walk. He pointed out that God took the seventh day of creation for a day of rest. The Hebrew word for Sabbath means *intermission* or *rest*. God knows what is best for us. In Matthew 11:²⁸⁻³⁰ we read "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened and I will give you rest... my yoke is easy and my burden is light." The Holy Spirit helps us do God's will with respect to rest

and renewal by imitating Christ. Fellowship and "hanging out" with other believers helps us to revisit where we have been and where we are headed in our faith-walk. As people, friends, workers, spouses, leaders, etc. we are not perfect. The reconciliation and renewal process is vital to our living a deeper and more joyous walk with God.






