MESSAGE: What's Love Got to Do With It?

Major Brandi stated emphatically, *Love has <u>everything</u> to do with it!* She told the story of John McLean, a fighter pilot shot down over North Korea and held as a POW for five years of brutal treatment. He, along with forty others were kept isolated but they found ways to communicate with each other. God created mankind to be social beings, interdependent on each other. Our purpose is to grow together through the Holy Spirit within the Church. The theme of the Scripture references in Galatians 5 and John 13 is *freedo*.in the Spirit

Gained by allowing God to live in us and through us so that we produce the fruits of the Spirit. (See Galatians $5:^{22-23}$). The expression used by Paul to describe the life of holiness is very effective as we learn that it is a process by which we allow God to live in and through us – not by gritting our teeth and trying harder to be more Christ-like. Just as eating fruit is good for us, the fruits of the Spirit set us free. The church in Galatia was guilty of infighting and devouring each other through jealousy and hatred. If the Galatians and we today were to allow the Spirit to produce those fruits, the first of which is Agape Love – an unconditional love which expresses itself in actions done in someone else's best interests unconditionally, our world and our lives would be totally different.. We all find it helpful to see Agape Love in action rather than try to define it.

Christ demonstrated this love when he washed his disciples' feet – an act of humility. When Peter protested that Christ should not wash his feet, Jesus replied, *Unless I was you, you have no part with me*. The message is clear - we need not only to be willing to serve but must be willing to be served. In order to love we must acknowledge we are loved. Christ laid down his life to save us; so ought we to give our lives for our fellows. If love can transform a Prison Camp in North Korea, how much more can it "change" our families, our churches and our communities. Before we can love like this, we have to accept Christ's love for us.



The sermon was concluded by the singing of Saviour If My Feet Have Faltered led by the Worship Team.



This morning's closing song, *God's Love is Wonderful* was accompanied by the Band. After Major Brandi closed in prayer, the Band's Postlude was *Keep in Step*.

Worship Service - Sunday, January 22, 2023 - Continued



Message: *The Joy of Network* Major Brandi opened by describing a German research project studying the characteristics of *healthy, effective churches* across the world, all denominations and community types. Chief among the findings was that one of the most significant traits of these churches was the quality of *joy*. The joy was described as deep happiness, Questions to consider about our level of joy would include where we were, from where

did it come, who was with us? When Christ lives in us and through us, our "joy" will be manifested along with other fruits of the Spirit but higher, purer and more powerful. Interestingly, in the German study that was done, the factors which affected a person's level of joy was <u>not</u> linked with their circumstances but to their relationships. Joy doesn't happen on its own but it flows from something – a wedding, the birth of a child. Our joy seldom happens on its own but with others who share the experience. Joy comes from God when we are "connected to the vine" and Galatians chapter 5 backs this up. Joy is a relational concept. Paul observes in Galatians 4 that, in spite of his illness, he was welcomed by the church but queries later, *What has happened to your joy?* The answer, of course, lies in their souring interpersonal relations within their church. We must remain vigilant to maintain a strong connection with each other and with God in order to reap the benefits of a greater experience of joy.

In Luke 10, we read that Jesus sent out 72 followers to preach and heal the sick. Even though the were not trained in ministry, they returned excited by the impact their message had brought – full of *joy* in exultation. People made Jesus smile. He told his disciples 'I want my joy to be yours'. Christ's intention was that we be rightly related to God and to each other through love because we need each other.





Your Building Advisory Committee (BAC) met via Zoom on Thursday, February 2nd. Major Brandi opened in prayer and then we proceeded with the agenda. Below is a summary of topics covered:

A. Outside / Grounds and Maintenance Projects:

i) Snow and Snow Clearance – Dave Holland has continued to emphasize with the plowing company that the Walkley Road piling is too large and access to the building and to the Disabled Parking spots is being hampered. On the day of the meeting, the company removed a lot of the snow from the north end of the lot and the results are much improved. (See pictures on page 8A). Next year, we will pursue access to a company with a blower to move the snow.

ii) Replacement of soffits around the perimeter of the building – new quotes will be sought as post-pandemic rates are more favorable. There is no danger of animal pests entering the building there.
 iii) New Disposal Company – As of April 1st, our trash removal will be done by Tomlinson's - a local company which will work on a two year contract for better rates than their predecessor.

B. Projects in Progress or Being Considered:

i) The Parking Lot should be ready for use in the spring. New lines were painted to outline the parking spots and signs indicating it is not a public parking lot have been installed.

ii) The Franek Company did a good job on the lawn care work last year so, if his rates are similar, there will be no change.

iii) Repairs to the HV/AC Unit over the Office will be completed in the spring. The awaited part has arrived from Texas. As it pertains to the air conditioning function, the part can be installed in the better weather with no impact on the unit's warranty..

iv) Implementation of the AED Preparedness Program – A proposal was presented for ensuring that all groups using the Corps throughout the week will have some identified people who could respond with the AED equipment in the event of someone suffering a cardiac episode in the building. Watch for details in the next few weeks.

C. New Projects:

i) Songster Sightline Issues – Dave Holland has worked with S/L Laurie to set up four rows of singers with good visual contact.

ii) Consideration of Constraints of the current Kitchen Facilities that would Impact new Feeding-Oriented Ministries. (Plumbing. Electrical and structural issues) Discussion ranged over the practicality and cost of effecting a Commercial Kitchen; availability of sufficient hot water; the fact that grants are available to cover or supplement resources for programs and facilities were all discussed. Stay tuned!

iii) Asbestos Removal from the Former Furnace Room to Create Storage Space – In light of the cost of the process and additional renovations that would be needed, it was determined that a better option would be to utilize the space in the Family Services Room for additional storage. iv) Renewal Date for Possible Renewal of Service Contract with Black & McDonald – the date is coming up to renew or not. Levels and compliance with the terms of the contract will be carefully reviewed.

D. Officers' Quarters Issues:

i) Replacement of Fence along Southern Lot Line – Dave Holland has agreed to pursue quotes for this work at the earliest possible time as companies will be responding to jobs now.
ii) Internet Requirements of the Security System – Notice has been received that the system will require 4G internet capacity shortly. Once Major Dwayne returns, this will be pursued in greater depth.

MESSAGE: The Peace Keeper

Major Brandi opened with a story about rescuers who went to a deserted island to care for a fellow who had been shipwrecked there. They discovered the man had built three huts. The first, he said, was his home; the second was his church and the third was the church where he used to attend. She went on to opine that many people leave their church because they have been hurt by disagreements and dissension amongst the people. From the passage in Galatians 5: ²²⁻²³ we read that the third fruit of the spirit listed is *peace*. Dictionary definitions of *peace* include the absence of acrimony and

strife but a relationship in which people get along with each other – a state of shalom. Christ is our *Peacekeeper*. The leader is the Peacekeeper. For the Galatian church, Paul had been the *Peacekeeper* but when he was away, false teachers began to stir up dissension and began teaching the people that they had to be governed by the Jewish laws. When Paul returned, he was dismayed at what had happened. He preached the love of God and trust in Christ so that faith came to many. Even now we see how doctrinal disputes can fracture the unity of churches. In John 20:¹⁹⁻²³ we read how Jesus met with his confused and fearful disciples and breathed the Holy Spirit on them. When he first entered the room where they met, Jesus said, *Peace be with you* and repeated this later. Ken Sande, who trained as an engineer dedicated his life to the ministry of reconciliation helping churches resolve disputes amongst congregants and leaders. Bringing order, harmony and fruitfulness to the body of believers is critical to our effectiveness in maintaining our sight of Christ, avoiding actions and attitudes that will stifle the work of the Spirit and learning to lean on the Spirit rather than our own strength. Allowing Christ, our *Peacekeeper* to work in and through us in love for one another in God and Christ-glorifying lives.

Major closed in prayer and then we sang There is Peace in the midst of the storms of my life.

abstract to *love* in the real world. After sharing her experience with the frustration she felt this past week in Ogdensburg this she reminded us all of our need for the power of the Spirit to help us with patience. In the *Love Chapter, 1 Corinthians 13,* Paul states that *Love is patient and Love is kind.* Indeed, patience governs our reactions to people and to circumstances. Because it's a relational thing. God's model for us is to never rush things because He operates on *perfect time.* God is patient as He works through his perfect plan. When we wonder why he hasn't returned for his church yet, it's because he is giving us all the

time we need. What about things that try our patience – How do we deal with the things and people that try our patience? What is our reaction? Just as we ask, so does the question arise sixty-five times in the Bible – *How long?* We read in Psalm 30:⁵ For his anger lasts only a moment, but his favour lasts a lifetime. Major pointed out that there are three questions : How long? Why? And How in the world? - which apply in sequence to suffering, trials and people. There are some secrets to each of these such as Learn to accept people as they are (See God's Continued on Page 14)

Model in Psalm 103:¹³⁻¹⁴; *Remember God's patience with us and focus on Heaven and Glory; Slow down Aad be long tempered! – read Psalm 103:* ⁸; Don't forget to pray for the fruits of the Sprit – especially Patience as in James 1: ^{19-20.} In conclusion, we need to be patient with one another and learn to accept people just as they are. "I will grow in patience as I allow the Spirit to govern my reactions". Examine your personal reactions to people and circumstances and pray that God will *grow* us to be more like Jesus in patience. Major closed in prayer and then led us in singing *Have Thine Own Way, Lord.*


