A Note from the Desk of Major Dwayne LeDrew

All of us have moments when we feel discouraged by life's circumstances. People may try to lighten our load or lift our spirits, but sometimes their efforts fall short. In these times, we wonder if we will ever emerge from

our struggle with our joy intact. Instead, we can find ourselves in despair. In Psalm 42, the psalmist questions the reason for his despair:

Why, my soul, are you downcast? Why so disturbed within me? Put your hope in God, for I will yet praise him, my Savior and my God. (Psalms 42:5 NIV).

Maybe this is you today; you're in despair over circumstances in your life. Lean in and listen to what the psalmist says. Note those two little words, "I will." This is a determination, a choice, not a feeling. The psalmist is choosing in the middle of his struggle and emotional despair to praise God, lift his perspective, and focus on the One who has victory. He reminds himself to put his hope in God, not in anything or anyone else.

When we choose to put our hope in God, it's not wishful thinking but an expectant hope, a confident hope. God is faithful, and He will come through for me. Jesus' last words to His disciples were a promise to always be with them.

Praising God in the hard times doesn't minimize or deny our heaviness of heart. Instead, it redirects our focus to our Savior and God. He promised never to leave or abandon His children, so we can count on His presence.

The Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit. (Psalms 34:18).

God sees our despair, but He doesn't want us to stay there, looking down. Instead, he tells us to look at Him. We can be people who say, "I will." We chose to praise God because He is a good Savior, our God. He's got this!


Major Dwayne's Message: Jesus Our Healer

Major opened his message based on Matthew 8: ¹⁻⁴ with the entry of the Leper – something unheard of because leprosy was the living death in which the priest would determine whether an individual was infected. If so, they would be condemned to be cut off from their family and friends. So feared was this disease that lepers were required to keep six feet from other people or 150 feet when it was windy. Major then reminded us that sin, like leprosy, separates us from God and our brokenness often creates barriers between our family and friends as well. But the leper looked beyond the law and his own

fears to come to Jesus for the healing he was sure Jesus could give. In spite of his disgusting appearance and state of being an outcast, the leper bows down before Jesus in worship and says, *Lord, if you are willing, you can make me clean.* Jesus' response was to reach out and touched the leper saying *I am willing. Be clean.*

The challenge Major Dwayne brought to us was *What do you bring to church this morning?* Do you feel that your brokenness and sin is so deep and your wrongdoing is so vile that nothing can be done? Once again, look at verse 3 of Matthew 8. There we read that the leper came in humility to Jesus and Jesus reached out and touched him bringing healing to the leper. If we humbly come to Jesus and confess our sins, his response to <u>us</u> will be *I understand, I know the sins you have committed and I will forgive you.* Indeed, Jesus has a miracle for you today. It is our privilege to serve an all-powerful God. What are you going to do about it now? He will heal your broken hearts and forgive you even if His answer seems different than you had expected. Jesus knows best!

In closing, Major had the words of the Songster selection, *Bow the Knee* on the screen as Laurie played the melody.

BUILDING ISSUES

The Building Advisory Committee (BAC) last met on February 2nd but much follow-up work has been done since that meeting. Here are a few of the matters that members of the BAC have been pursuing:

- Replacement of Fence at the Officers' Quarters: The contract has now been signed and, depending on weather conditions, work could begin as early as June 1st.
- Hot Water Situation at the Corps: For some reason, the wait for hot water in the kitchen and south washrooms seems to be increasing. Plumbing companies have been consulted and invited to submit solutions and costs entailed. The hot water heater has always been located in the old furnace room so the "pipe run" is very long and mostly in an unheated ceiling cavity.
- Hanging Light Fixtures in the Sanctuary (Oxford Units): Almost all of the lighting in the Sanctuary utilizes LED lamps with the exception of the lower portion of the hanging fixtures these are 500 watt incandescent lamps. When all the lights are on, these bulbs alone are burning 4500 watts of electrical current. LED lamps of this size are not compatible with our dimming system which eliminates switching to LED lamps as a solution. Further, as was discovered in the last month, 500 watt incandescent bulbs are no longer widely available. We have imported six lamps from the United States and a local electrical firm tracked down four more of them so the supply will serve us for a few years yet but at a cost. Another project for the BAC!
- One of the positive effects of communal eating is the social and spiritual benefit derived. Addressing the needs of people within the Corps and the local community is something that we, as The Salvation Army, can do well. In order to raise this to a program level, however, will require some adaptations to our kitchen, its serving capacity and comfortable seating for those of the elderly and lonely. Another project?

Message: A Mission for the Father

(Major Dwayne)

Major opened by reading from Luke 9 and 19 telling of Jesus setting out for Jerusalem where he knew he would die but on his journey, he healed, raised the

dead, healed lepers had lunch with Zacchaeus, brought hope and joy to the discouraged. People were drawn to him and followed him. As he neared Jerusalem, Jesus sent two of his disciples to get a donkey for

Him to ride – a significant animal for his ride in humility. Major Dwayne raised a poignant question: *If a donkey that had never been ridden could be submissive in serving Christ, why is submission so difficult for us?* Jeus was given a royal welcome with shouts of Hosanna as they praised him The Pharisees and Sadducees, however, saw him as a threat to their power and claimed his disciples were guilty of blasphemy. Jesus' replied that if he compelled them to be silent, even the rocks would cry out. When Jesus finally saw Jerusalem, he wept for the sin and depravity he saw knowing that they would reject his message. On this Palm Sunday, we need to shout Hosanna and develop a heart for others, reaching out in love to help them in their need.

The Message: Why Was the Stone Moved?

Similarly, fears and failures were stones for the disciples. Major Brandi listed five *stones* that had arisen for the disciples with the death of Jesus including disillusionment and disappointment. But when Mary and all the other followers saw Jesus, they

MAJOR BRANDI'S MESSAGE CONTINUED – were overjoyed. In total, apart from Christ, our lives are full of disappointment and failure. We need to put all our *eggs in the right basket*. Like the disciples, we often find ourselves hiding behind locked doors in prisons of our own making. Praise God because, when Jesus stood in their midst, He brought *Peace* and the promise that *I am with you until the end of the age*. Most of us can identify with the skepticism of Thomas but he, too, had the stone rolled away as he recognized Jesus as *My lord and My God!* Death confronts us all but Christ conquered death and gave us eternal life through His resurrection. We may wonder why God removed the stone from Christ's tomb when Christ could have easily reconfigured himself outside the tomb. Clearly, having the stone removed permitted the women, several disciples and all of us vicariously to see and understand that the tomb was empty – Christ had arisen on Easter morn. Death has been vanquished and Christ is here for all of us,

Fittingly, the sermon ended with the singing of Because He Lives. The empty tomb proves that My Saviour Lives!

64. Maturing in Christ

When I was a child, I talked like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. When I became a man, I put childish ways behind me. (1 Corinthians 13:11 NIV)

Brothers, I could not <u>address</u> you as spiritual but as worldly – mere <u>infants</u> in Christ. I gave you <u>milk</u>, not <u>solid food</u>, for you were not yet ready for it. Indeed, you still are not ready. You are still worldly. For since there is <u>jealousy</u> and quarreling among you, are you not worldly? Are you not <u>acting</u> like mere men? For when one says, "I follow Paul." And another, "follow Apollos," are you not mere men? What, after all is <u>Apollos</u>? And what is Paul" Only servant, through whom you came to believe —as the Lord has <u>assigned</u> to each his task. I <u>planted</u> the seed, Apollos <u>watered</u> it, but God made it grow. (1 Corinthians 3:2-6 NIV)

We have much to say about this, but it is hard to <u>explain</u> because you are slow to learn. In fact, though you need someone to teach you the <u>elementary</u> truths of God's word all over again. You need milk, not solid food! Anyone who lives on milk, being still an infant, is not <u>acquainted</u> with the teaching about righteousness. But solid food is for the <u>mature</u>, who by <u>constant</u> use have trained themselves to distinguish good from evil.

Therefore let us have <u>leave</u> the elementary teachings about Christ and go on to maturity, not <u>laying</u> again the foundation of <u>repentance</u> from acts that lead to death, and of faith in God, <u>instruction</u> about <u>baptisms</u>, the laying on of hands, the resurrection of the dead, and eternal <u>judgment</u>. And God <u>permitting</u>, we will do so. (Hebrews 5:11-6:3 NIV)

The Message - Called to Live Easter Sunday Lives

Major Dwayne opened with the question, "How do we live *resurrected* lives?" While we have seen the risen Christ, and as believers, gone from darkness to light, sadness to joy, what happens when life isn't so joyous anymore? In Matthew28:5 we read the words *Be not afraid*. Both the women and the Roman soldiers had reasons to fear for

their lives. Looking to our present-day lives, what fears do we have? Our fears are generated by concerns like health, money, careers, relationships and many phobias that Major mentioned. Whether they persist in your life or not, remember that the living Saviour is in our midst. The same power that raised him from the dead is available to us today. The only fear we are to have is the *fear of God* – reverence, awe and respect. Remember the message of that first Easter – *He is not here* – *He is alive!* Major switched focus by asking "How many have a calendar that you live by? ... a calendar that is so full that we are constantly on the go? Does that *calendar* hinder our development and nurturing our relationship with God and with other people?

Remember what the angel said to the Marys in Matthew 28:7 – Then go quickly and tell his disciples: He has risen from the dead and is going ahead of you into Galilee where Jesus met them and said, Do not be afraid. Go and tell my brothers... For us today, we need to study his Word, pray, share the Good News and walk with Jesus. Major ended with the singing of the chorus, He is Lord.






