
Looking for Devotionals?

When the 'Unexpected Happens'

In the summer of 1994, at the age of 29, the unexpected happened that would change the course of my life forever. I was a school teacher at the time, and at this point, God was far from my mind. Little did I know, however, that He was working out His plan for the next chapter of my journey. The next six months were filled with a roller coaster ride of events as I tried to process what was happening. It was through a number of unexpected events and changes in my life at the time that I began to experience an inner turmoil that resulted in weeks of restlessness and conviction. It was at this point that God was getting my attention and often, I would wonder if He was who others were claiming him to be and if He could actually love a sinner like me.

On February 12, 1995, the wondering was over, as I knelt at a mercy seat at The Salvation Army Church in La Scie, NL and prayed a simple prayer: "Jesus, forgive me for my sin, and if you are real and are willing to take my life and make it into something new, then this morning, I ask you to be my Saviour." Amen. I did not expect anything supernatural, but the unexpected happened. I felt free and everything around me – people, nature, life – it all looked different. At that moment, not only did God save me from my sin, but He radically changed who I was. As I went to school the following day, word had already spread throughout the small community of 1200 people. I did not know what to expect when I arrived at school the following day. While some close colleagues responded with "Good for you Jim," others said nothing and appeared perplexed at what had happened. For the next couple of months, life was good, and through Bible Study and Church Fellowship, I was growing in my faith. But, then, the unexpected happened. I received a notice from the school board that my position at the local school was becoming redundant, and effective June 30 of that year, my position would no longer be available. As I tried to make sense of this news, something supernatural was happening within my soul; an unexpected sense of peace filled my being, and as a new believer in Christ, I chose to trust God for the next chapter of my journey.

As I began to try and figure out the unexpected change of events in my life, I thought it wise to start applying for new teaching positions. Within a couple of months, God had provided a new opportunity on the other side of the province. It would become clear to me that God was 'in the details.' This next chapter of my journey would see a number of new, exciting, and unexpected events continuing to unfold - including meeting my wife Michelle, a calling to become a Salvation Army Officer, an acceptance into The College for Officer Training, a resignation from teaching, and a wedding © - all within 16 months. God's plan was continuing to unfold before me.

Following two years of intensive training at CFOT in St. John's, NL, Michelle and I were appointed to Spryfield, a Corps in inner city Halifax. Following a seven-year appointment and completion of a building project, TSA moved us to Orillia with our two children (both born in Halifax) - son Kaelan age 4 and our daughter Olivia just 5 weeks old. After six wonderful years as Corps Officers in Orillia, we were appointed to The Barrhaven Church (and another building project). After seven great years at Barrhaven, the unexpected happened again. This time, we would be staying in Ottawa but with separate appointments. Michelle was appointed at Divisional Headquarters as Divisional Secretary for Women's Ministry and I was appointed as Social Mission Officer at The Ottawa Booth Centre. This is where my journey in ministry and mission took on an unexpected, yet fulfilling twist, as God once again showed Himself in every detail of my experience.

A New Chapter

Little did I know after arriving at The Ottawa Booth Centre how God would work out the details of this appointment. For the first few months, I began to question whether this was the 'right move.' There were days when I wondered what God was up to. For the first time in 20 years, I felt like I had no significant leadership responsibility. My title as Social Mission Officer did not even have a job description. While I knew that I was 'in training' to become an Executive Director of a Social Ministry, I found the transition from Corps Officer to Social somewhat challenging - as I am a Pastor at heart and have a passion to share the Gospel with others. So, how can this be? Then, God gave me a verse to remind me of my calling and His faithfulness. "Now he who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will also supply and increase your store of seed and will enlarge the harvest of your righteousness." My presence here at Ottawa Booth has not only become a training ground for executive leadership but more importantly, it has become a mission field for sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Almost every day, God provides opportunities to sow seeds for the Kingdom. Whether it is teaching Celebrate Recovery to men at The Salvation Army Anchorage Program, or engaging clients and staff at a weekly coffee house, or simply speaking life into unhoused men and women who frequent the parameters of our shelter on a daily basis, God continues to remind me that He is at work in every detail of my journey.

As I continue to embrace this new ministry opportunity, I hear God saying that whether it is at The Ottawa Booth Centre, in a Corps setting, or simply in a community context, the mission is the same – people need the Lord! There is no other greater mission field for the work of The Salvation Army in these days than at its social ministry units. On any given night, 150 men sign in to our shelter at 171 George Street. Many are men who are broken and bruised from trauma, addictions, and homelessness. Some are simply men without a place to live and life's circumstances have led them down a path they had never expected. Others are new to Canada, and with the housing crisis, they are unable to find a place to live. Whatever their circumstances, God has raised up The Salvation Army to be a neighbour to these men here at The Ottawa Booth Centre. Daily, it is our mission to provide hope and dignity to those who feel hopeless and marginalized. *For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me.* (Matthew 25:35-36)

I am not certain what the next chapter of my journey will look like, but as I look back and see God's hand in and through the details, I am confident that "He who began a good work in me is promised to carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus." (Phil.1:6) And, so for the next chapters, I simply choose "to trust in the Lord with all of my heart, to lean not on my own understanding, but in all of my ways, acknowledge Him, and I am confident that He will direct my path." (Proverbs 3:5-6) (paraphrase mine).

As I reflect on the 'unexpected' in my life, I am reminded of the words from a contemporary Christian song by Big Katy Nichole & Big Daddy Weave:

God is in this story God is in the details Even in the broken parts He holds my heart, He never fails When I'm at my weakest
I will trust in Jesus
Always in the highs and lows
The One who goes before me
God is in this story

BUILDING ISSUES

The Building Advisory Committee (BAC) last met on October 25th. While a number of initiatives are under consideration, there are only three which have progressed since the last Report:

- Over Christmas, Sean van Gulik and John van Guilk installed a new camera and made adjustments to the microphone feeds that should improve the overall experience for those who participate via virtual worship.
- Having heard from DHQ regarding the Community Outreach Proposal, in the coming month we
 will be pursuing the next steps, namely hiring a Kitchen Consultant to develop preliminary
 drawings and further developing the details of the program itself.
- The City of Ottawa has confirmed that it will plant a red oak tree at the south east corner of the property in the spring as part of the *Trees in Trust Program*.







SERJES on CHARACTERJSTJCS OF GOOD LEADERS - Part 1

In the last edition of the Ottawa Citadel *Contact*, we introduced our plan to establish a series on the qualities and practices of "Good Leadership". Focusing a spotlight on the basics of leadership, it is hoped that this will be a helpful series for those considering taking on a leadership role or for those already in leadership positions, providing a reference to alternative solutions for challenges they face.

There is an endless list of source material on line and, amazingly, the assessment of the various traits and techniques employed by leaders is pretty consistent. For the purposes of this month's edition, the *Centre for Creative Leadership's* articles has been selected as a reliable source. Below is their analysis of **WHAT GOOD LEADERSHIP LOOKS LIKE.** It opens with "Based upon our decades of research and experience working with leaders at organizations around the world, we've found that the best leaders consistently possess certain fundamental qualities and skills. Here are 10 essential leadership traits".

10 Essential Leadership Qualities

- 1. Integrity Integrity is an essential leadership trait for the individual and the organization. It's especially important for top-level executives who are charting the organization's course and making countless other significant decisions. Our research has found that integrity may actually be a potential blind spot for organizations, so make sure your organization reinforces the importance of honesty and integrity to leaders at various levels.
- 2. **Delegation** Delegating is one of the core responsibilities of a leader, but it can be tricky to delegate effectively. The goal isn't just to free yourself up it's also to enable your direct reports to grow, facilitate teamwork, provide autonomy, and lead to better decision-making,. The best leaders build trust in the workplace (church) and on their teams through effective delegation.
- 3. **Communication** Effective leadership and effective communication are intertwined. The best leaders are skilled communicators who are able to communicate in a variety of ways, from transmitting information to inspiring others to coaching direct reports. And you must be able to listen to and communicate with a wide range of people across roles, geographies, social identities and more. The quality and effectiveness of communication among leaders across your organization directly affects the success of your business (ministry) strategy too.
- 4. **Self-Awareness** While this is a more inwardly focused trait, self-awareness and humility are paramount qualities of leadership. The better you understand yourself and recognize your own strengths and weaknesses, the more effective you can be as a leader. Do you know how other people view you and understand how you show up at work and at home?
- **5. Gratitude** Being thankful can lead to higher self-esteem, reduced depression and anxiety, and better sleep. Gratitude can even make you a better leader. Yet few people regularly say "thank you" in work settings, even though most people say they'd be willing to work harder for an appreciative boss (committee leader). The best leaders know how to show gratitude in the workplace (church).
- 6. **Learning Agility** Learning agility is the ability to know what to do when you don't know what to do. If you're a "quick study" or are able to excel in unfamiliar circumstances, you might already be learning agile. But anybody can <u>foster and increase learning agility through practice, experience and effort</u>. After all, great leaders are really great learners.

CHARACTERISTICS OF GOOD LEADERS Part 1 - concluded

- **7. Influence** For some people, "influence" feels like a dirty word. But being able to <u>convince people</u> through the influencing tactics of logical, emotional, or co-operative appeals is an important trait of inspiring, effective leaders. Influence is quite different from manipulation, and it needs to be done authentically and transparently. It requires emotional intelligence and trust.
- **8. Empathy** Empathy is correlated with job performance and is a critical part of <u>emotional</u> <u>intelligence and leadership effectiveness</u>. If you show more inclusive leadership and empathetic behaviours toward your direct reports, our research shows you're more likely to be viewed as a better performer by your boss (leader). Plus, <u>empathy and inclusion are imperatives</u> for improving workplace (church) conditions for those around you.
- **9. Courage** It can be hard to speak up at work (or a church committee), whether you want to voice a new idea, provide feedback to a direct report, or flag a concern for someone above you. That's part of the reason courage is a key trait of good leaders. Rather than avoiding problems or allowing conflicts to fester, having courage enables leaders to step up and move things in the right direction. A workplace (church) with high levels of psychological safety and strong conversational skills across the organization will foster a <u>coaching culture that supports courage and truth-telling</u>.
- **10. Respect** Treating people with respect on a daily basis is one of the most important things a leader can do. It helps ease tensions and conflict, fosters trust, and improves your effectiveness. <u>Creating a culture of respect</u> is about more than just the absence of disrespect. Respectfulness can be shown in many different ways, but it often starts with showing you truly value others' perspectives and making an effort to <u>build belonging in the workplace (church committee)</u>—both critical components of supporting equity, diversity, and inclusion.




