Curiosity



(A devotional taken from *Words of Life*, page 59, January – April 2019, written by a former Ottawa Citadel Corps Officer, Major Beverly Ivany - based on Deuteronomy 13: 1-11)

If a prophet, or one who foretells by dreams ... says, 'and let us worship them' you must not listen

to the words of that prophet or dreamer. (vv 1-3)

Many of us have heard the expression, 'Curiosity killed the cat.' It is a proverb warning of dangers that lie in experimentation. Curiosity hasn't received very good press over the years. Saint Augustine wrote in his *Confessions* of AD 397 that, long before creating Heaven and earth, God 'fashioned hell for the inquisitive'. Pretty strong words! In *Don Juan*, Lord Byron called curiosity 'that low vice'. We might disagree – thinking curiosity is rather good and sometimes even fun! But when it beckons us away from what is right and holy, curiosity then becomes very dangerous.

In today's passage of Scripture the Lord is telling his people that in the new land men and women will try to entice them to worship their gods; prophets and dreamers might appear to be somewhat appealing. The Israelites were not to be fooled by them, not to 'listen' to them. God said all this in order to see where they were spiritually:

The Lord your God is testing you to find out whether you love him with all your heart and with all your soul. It is the Lord your God you must follow, and him you must revere. Keep his commands and obey him; serve him and hold fast to him (vv 3-4).

Lots of things are 'out there' to lure us away from the Lord, and sometimes curiosity can get the better of us. We wonder: 'What would it be like? Others seem to be enjoying themselves, so why not me? Who will ever know if I give it a try? I only have one life!'

If curiosity can 'kill a cat', how much more will yielding to temptation harm us – in ways we can't even begin to imagine? As followers of Christ we are to always be so careful. To stay very close to him. To love the Lord supremely – with all our heart, soul and spirit.

Did You Know?

The Salvation Army began dispensing food and drinks near Ground Zero less than an hour after the 2001 terrorist attacks on the Twin Towers. In our nearly nine months of service there, 40,000 Salvation Army volunteers, staff and officers assisted 4.5 million people with meals, pastoral counseling and social services. The Canada and Bermuda Territory sent 24 teams of workers to New York City from October 2001 until July of 2002.

Application will be made to Headquarters to release funds in our account to cover the cost of the flooring removal and replacement.


