Pastoral Ponderings



A member of a certain church, who previously had been attending services regularly, stopped going. After a few weeks, the Pastor decided to visit him. It was a chilly evening. The Pastor found the man at home alone, sitting before a blazing fire. Guessing the reason for his Pastor’s visit, the man welcomed him, led him to a big chair near the fireplace and waited.

The Pastor made himself comfortable but said nothing. In the grave silence, he contemplated the play of the flames around the burning logs. After some minutes, the pastor took the fire tongs, carefully picked up a brightly burning ember and placed it to one side of the hearth all alone. Then he sat back in his chair, still silent.

The host watched all this in quiet fascination. As the one lone ember’s flame diminished, there was a momentary glow and then its fire was no more. Soon it was cold and “dead as a doornail.” Not a word had been spoken since the initial greeting.

Just before the Pastor was ready to leave, he picked up the cold, dead ember and placed it back in the middle of the fire.

Immediately it began to glow once more with the light and warmth of the burning coals around it. As the Pastor reached the door to leave, his host said, “Thank you so much for your visit and especially for the fiery sermon. I shall be back in church next Sunday.”

To someone who understands church and what it's all about, going to church can be the most spiritually fulfilling, inspiring thing you do all week.

Looking at the example of this very first group of Christians, recorded in Acts 2:41-47, reveals five reasons why the church exists and why you should be a part of it. *(Continued on Page 1-A)*

Membership (v41) – a place to belong.

Magnify (v46-47) – It's about Jesus. Church gives us an opportunity to worship God the Father and his Son Jesus, through the power of the Holy Spirit.

Maturity (v42) – As Rick Warren puts it, *"The Spirit of God uses the Word of God to make you more like the Son of God."*

Ministry (v43-45) – You were put on earth to contribute. God wants you to give something back. The Bible says, *"God has made us what we are. In Christ Jesus, God made us to do good works, which God planned for us to live our lives doing"* (Eph 2:10).

Mission (v47) - In church, we all have the same mission: to share the Good News of Jesus and his saving grace with a bent and broken world. *"Therefore, go and make disciples of all the nations, [a] baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit"* (Mt 28:19).

When you understand what it means to not just go to church, but be the church, you discover your life's true purpose—you were made to be a member of his family, to magnify his glory, to mature in his image, to be a minister of his mercy, and be a missionary of his grace.

Young people and youth are encouraged to participate in this exciting annual event.



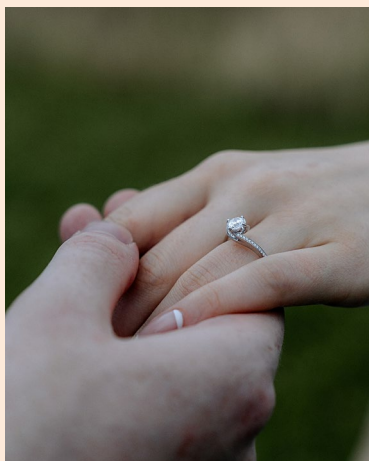

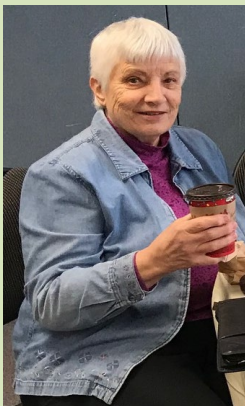
More News Items of Note

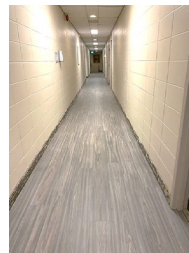
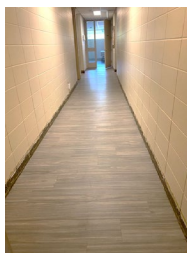
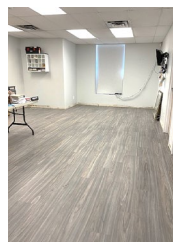
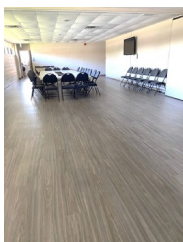
Your Building Advisory Committee (BAC) last met at 1:00 pm on May 22nd.

- The main item to report in this edition of the *Contact* is that THQ released the funds from our account to replace the flooring in the corridors, south rooms and rear entrance to the Sanctuary. The work on this project began on September 4th with the removal of the existing carpeting and then cleaning and leveling of the concrete base. Although this did cause some minor inconveniences on Sunday, September 8th with the limited access to washrooms and cancellation of the usual after-the-meeting coffee and fellowship, things continued pretty much as usual.

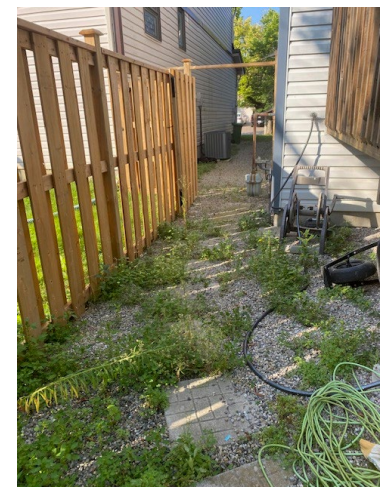


The rads in the Nursery and the Wiseman Room have been removed and David did a great job on the “make-good” repairs to the walls.

Picking Up the Leadership Thread from Last Spring

WHY IS THIS AN IMPORTANT TOPIC TO CONSIDER IN OUR CORPS?

Over the course of average years in a church of our size and the significant programs and groups that require effective and reliable leadership, it is only natural that we should take the task of preparing and training our leaders seriously. It is essential that our Corps embodies the *Best for the Highest* when we entrust individuals with the responsibility to make all Corps programs strong and delivering the highest form of direction that will, in a word, contribute to the worship activities within Ottawa Citadel.

Major Barbara Sampson of the New Zealand, Fiji, Tonga and Samoa Territory writes in the May-August 2024 edition of the *Words of Life* the following within the *Restorer* piece on August 21st:

In the traditional Japanese art of “kintsugi”, broken or cracked pottery pieces are repaired with lacquer often mixed with gold. The crack is not hidden but in fact accentuated so that the restored article is not simply mended but beautifully, uniquely so.

God the Restorer can deal with the cracked vessels of our lives – broken relationships, financial setbacks. Losses of faith and hope. If something is broken in your life today or in the life of someone you love, bring the need to God the Restorer. Give it into his care. Then wait and watch in prayerful anticipation for how he will not only repair but may even restore the matter to a beauty beyond its former glory.

If you have an interest in providing leadership in our church, allow the Holy Spirit to speak to your heart and pray that you would be empowered to partake in the Restorer role described in Major Sampson’s devotional above.

In the *Harvard Business Review*, Rebecca Knight writes an inspirational article describing “8 Essential Qualities of Successful Leaders”. What she shares in that article is helpful to anyone feeling led to be a leader in our Corps. The following is a brief summary of what she has to say. According to Professor Linda Hill, the top eight most important qualities for successful leadership are:

1. Authenticity

Being genuine and true to who you are is fundamental to success in any role. Hill says that as a leader, you must embody your best self – the version that’s not only highly effective but also capable of motivating and inspiring those around you. “Your competence is not enough; people need to trust your character and connect with you.... Understanding how people perceive you is crucial for growth. But asking for and receiving feedback can be complicated

and emotional, says Hill. She recommends seeking feedback at a time when you can remain open, without becoming defensive.

2. Curiosity

Hill says that curiosity is a mindset: “It’s about looking around the corner, exploring uncharted territories, and trying to understand the art of the possible.”

How to nurture your curiosity. Children are born curious, naturally inclined to be inquisitive and explore their surroundings, notes Hill, so take your cue from them... Don’t be afraid to ask basic or naïve questions ... Think expansively and ambitiously. “You need to always ask about moonshot ideas: What *could* we be doing?” she says.

3. Analytical Prowess:

Leadership requires the ability to break down complex problems, identify their root causes, and come up with fresh solutions, according to Hill. Trusting your gut will not suffice. Instead, you need to develop your analytical skills by focusing on cause-and-effect relationships and being attentive to patterns and trends.

4. Adaptability:

Adaptability fosters an agile team culture, [Hill] adds/ It allows you to be able to swiftly respond to different dynamics, pivot when needed, and embrace new opportunities and challenges. *To strengthen your adaptability, remember that we learn by doing* so you need to take on assignments and seek out experiences that demand flexibility, says Hill.

5. Creativity:

Any idea that is new and useful to (your group) is creativity.... Diversity of thought is the driving force behind true innovation, as each of us brings our own unique perspective and “slice of genius” to the table she adds. *How to cultivate your creativity:* Your role as a leader isn’t necessarily to come up with all the great ideas on your own, but rather to establish an environment that nurtures creativity in others and recognizes the interconnectedness of their thinking , says Hill.

6. Comfort with ambiguity:

To be an effective leader, you need to cultivate a systems mindset, “which helps you understand how things are connected and allows you to grapple opposing ideas in the face of uncertainty. But at times, she says, you might still feel as though you’re “navigating through a fog.” ... Embracing ambiguity requires that you immerse yourself in the complexity of different situations.

7. Resilience:

Successful leaders recognize the fluid nature of situations and strive to understand the cultural context within which they operate. Most important, they exhibit the resilience to recalibrate if they’re veering off course. “You need to know how to regroup and get input from others by asking, “Is there another path?” she says.

8. Empathy:

Understanding and connecting with others on an emotional level is a key trait of strong leadership, according to Hill. Leaders must foster relationships, build trust, and actively engage with their team members. You need to be able to step into the shoes of your team members, understand what matters to them, what their priorities are, and identify common ground. (Prayerful interaction with those around you is critical – the Editor)

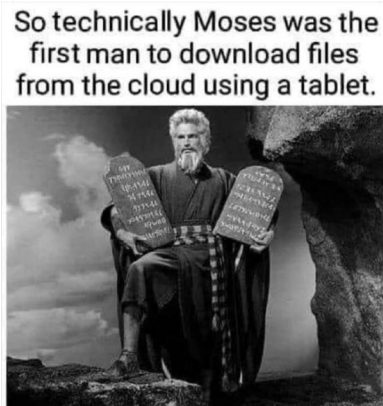
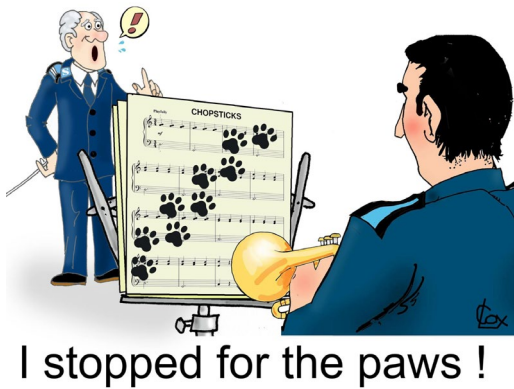
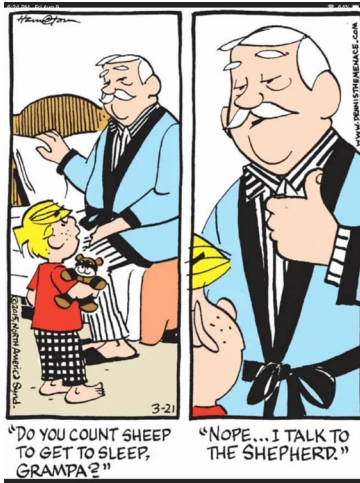
