

Ottawa Citadel "Kicked Off" the Annual Christmas Kettle Campaign November 22nd



BUILDING ISSUES

Your Building Advisory Committee (BAC) has not officially met in recent months but there have been a few issues that the members have discussed.

Most recently, the HV/AC unit servicing the south rooms including the Fellowship Room has developed problems that must be addressed immediately. It was found to be producing high levels of carbon monoxide; the heat exchanger is partially blocked and requires replacement; the inducer motor needs to be replaced. The cost of these repairs is approximately \$5,500 including taxes.

Have you noticed the bright lighting in the corridors recently? There's a reason! The pot lights were upgraded to LED fixtures and the effect is dazzling.

One other item that is of current concern is the installation of fixed/protected ladders to access the various roof levels. Bids have now been received with one very attractive offer so far as detail and price. As these ladders are now a "Code" matter, we have no choice but to proceed with their installation. This will take place the week of January 13th.

THE AGE OF THE MUSICALS - WORDS & MUSIC BY GOWANS & LARSSON

Generals Gowans and Larsson introduced not just the Salvation Army but the Christian world to meaningful songs grounded in the story-line of a musical. In many cases, powerful expressions of the message of salvation emerged from many of those songs. This comment in no way should diminish the importance the other songs upon which the story needed the words of songs to emphasize the meaning of the total musical play but we cannot under-value the spiritual impact of many of the songs.

Let's take a quick look at the first two of their musicals – Take-Over Bid and Hosea These two musicals could not be more different in style and substance.

In an interview of John Larsson by Tony Cummings, we read, "the theme of Take-Over Bid", based on the concept of the Holy Spirit impacting a group of young Salvationists, was a highly controversial idea, one likely to raise the hackles of conservative church-goers.... However, the Youth Secretary did a great PR job... in raising expectations for the new approach to music" said Larsson.

Quoting from Major Stan Ditmer and Major Vernon Post's description of this musical gives a pretty good idea of how this production developed. "The musical was written by two British Salvation Army captains, John Larsson and John Gowans, who had collaborated on what the program describes as the fabulous musical 'Takeover Bid'. First seen in London in 1968 and later translated for use in many countries.

The production takes the form of a musical within a musical by retelling the Biblical story of Hosea, the Hebrew prophet, in modern and ancient settings.

In spite of a number of very attractive songs in this musical, only "You can't stop God from loving you" survived to the Song Book in #72. Verse 3 says: You can't stop God from loving you Though you may disobey Him; You cant stop God from loving you, However you betray Him; From love like this no power on earth — The human heart can sever, You can't stop God from loving you, Not God — not now, nor ever.

Leadership in Our Church - Part 5

The editor has decided to give the readers a short break from reporting on searches of the expert literature on the skills and techniques of effective leadership. Instead, in this issue, we will create a short list of common-sense behaviours of effective leaders.

Here are a few reminders that may be helpful, whether you are an experienced leader or are just recently appointed to a position of leadership:

- YOU DON'T HAVE TO KNOW EVERYTHING: Sometimes, when we are first appointed to a leadership role, in our nervous desire to do a great job, we decide that we can do all things and be able to answer all questions. Not so! Those whom you lead often appreciate someone who reaches out to them seeking guidance. You're human! This leads to several other bits of advice —
- SURROUND YOURSELF WITH PEOPLE POSSESSING A WIDE VARIETY OF SKILLS: It's
 interesting that we are inclined to gather people with like mindsets and similar
 values. This is usually a comfortable arrangement but not necessarily a
 productive one. As leaders, we benefit from having mentors who have differing
 points of view and who will challenge our initiatives if we are getting "stuck in a
 rut".
- ABOVE ALL ELSE, CARE ABOUT THE PEOPLE YOU HAVE BEEN ASSIGNED TO LEAD:
 While its is important to get the job done, it is even more important to nurture
 and minister to your group members remember you are leading a "church
 group". It is helpful to have identified group members who have a
 compassionate personality who would be able to provide counsel to someone
 who is hurting if you asked them to do so. That would relieve you of becoming
 overly involved in some situations that entail gender issues.
- KEEP AN EYE ON THE GOALS OF YOUR GROUP: Over the weeks and months of becoming engrossed in the details of leading your group, it is easy to lose sight of the forest for the trees. That is, in everything you do as a leader, it is essential that the overall purpose and goal of your group remains your priority. Without being pedantic, it is important that you keep those goals in the consciousness of your group. They shouldn't lose sight of why they are there.
- HAVE FUN!: The more you enjoy what you are doing, the more the members of your group will develop positive attitudes toward the goals and ministry of your people.


