RECONSTRUCT YOUR HEART!

How's your heart? Apparently, my Doctor is concerned about mine.



She's sending me for a stress test. My family history supports her concern. So, truth is, I have a 'heart condition.'

But then, don't we all?

As Christians, our heart's condition depends on the things we allow into our heart. These things form our thoughts and attitudes, and ultimately, shape the deepest part of our being. No matter what our circumstances (outside) are, if our heart (inside) is right, we're going to be okay.

Therefore, we need to check our heart a lot more often than we do. Because many times, believers can go through the motions and keep doing the "Christian thing," but something has crept into their hearts and is hurting them and others.





WHAT GOOD LEADERSHIP LOOKS LIKE (Source: Center for Creative Leadership)

The CCL summarizes our return to this topic as follows: Based upon our decades of research and experience working with leaders at organizations around the world, we've found that the best leaders consistently possess certain fundamental qualities and skills. Here are 10 essential leadership traits:

- 1. **Integrity** we need to reinforce the importance of honesty and integrity to leaders at various levels.
- **2. Delegation** one of the core responsibilities of a leader... because it can facilitate teamwork, provide autonomy and lead to better decision-making.
- **3.** Communication the best leaders are skilled communicators who are able to communicate in a variety of ways, from transmitting information, to inspiring others to coaching direct reports.
- **4. Self-Awareness** (the effective leader must monitor the impact of his or her actions on the group and must include a willingness to listen to what group members are saying about what is taking place.)
- **5. Gratitude** Being thankful can lead to higher self-esteem ... and reduced depression. The best leaders know to show gratitude *to their group members*.
- 6. Learning Agility is the ability to know what to do when you don't know what to do... anybody can foster and increase learning agility through practice, experience and effort. After all, great leaders are really great learners.
- 7. **Influence** being able to convince people through the influencing tactics of logical, emotional or cooperative appeals is an important trait of inspiring, effective leaders.
- **8. Empathy** is an important part of emotional intelligence and leadership effectiveness.... Empathy and inclusion are imperatives for improving ... conditions for those around you.
- 9. Courage whether you want to voice a new idea, provide feedback to a direct report, or flag a concern for someone above you, courage is a key trait of good ideas. Rather than avoiding problems or allowing conflicts to fester, having courage enables leaders to step up and move things in the right direction.
- 10. Respect Effective leaders treat their teams with respect, which can help them gain respect in return. Effective leaders show their respect by empowering their team to make decisions and use their expertise to achieve goals. Remember, the leader of a group isn't the only person with ideas and answers.

Editorial Comment: Being an effective leader is not "rocket science". It is all about using the skills and personal traits you possess to encourage the members of your group to do their best and provide them with an accepting atmosphere that encourages them to contribute their skills and ideas to the group. A library of skill sets and traits such as the ones listed above from the Center for Creative Leadership will be helpful.

Fact: The world's oldest wooden wheel has been around for more than 5,000 years

UPDATE

BUILDING ISSUES

Your Building Advisory Committee (BAC) met on the afternoon of January 28th and reviewed several issues. Among the topics discussed were:

- <u>Soffit Replacement Project:</u> Bids were received from two companies and one was selected to complete the work once weather permits. This replacement has become quite urgent this past year.
- <u>Building Security and Lock/Key Upgrades</u>: Kudos to CSM Linda for pursuing this matter. New keys are now being distributed following the replacement of tumblers and lock mechanisms.
- The Status of the HV/AC Roof Units. Of particular interest was the significant cost of repairs apparently needed to the unit serving the south side rooms. The servicing company has been challenged to further explain those repairs. This has been resolved.
- The Status of the Programmed Replacement of the HV/AC Units was Revisited. It was determined that the time had come to meet with the area manager of the company to discuss the concerns about the quality of service in recent months.
- The Roof Access Ladders have now been Installed: This was a legal responsibility for our Corps as the lack of the ladders was categorized as a "Health and Safety" Issue.
- <u>CSM Linda Updated the BAC on the Progress on the Replacement of the Kitchen Dishes</u>
 <u>Storage Cupboards</u>: This phase is now complete. The existing storage cupboards between the Kitchen and the Fellowship Room were removed and stainless steel metal units were installed for the Kitchen dishes.. (See photos below:)













Continuing Series - Salvation Army Song Writers #6

As we move into the next two musicals created by John Larsson and John Gowans, we encounter the creation of "Spirit". This musical in particular proved to be especially attractive to many other Christian denominations. In Ottawa, for instance, one of the large Pentecostal churches did a major production of *Spirit* with many performances.



Although only a few songs from these musicals are still included in our Song Book, this is only an indication that in the subsequent revisions, some of the songs had to be deleted to make room for newer music.

The Salvation Army musicals had an impact on participants and audiences alike. As a new genre in the '60s and 70s especially, they appealed to expressions of human characteristics, directing non-Christians as well as believers to the power of Christ and the Holy Spirit.

This musical was especially significant for the people of Ottawa Citadel. The Corps Officers at this Corps in 1974 were Majors Dave and Beverly Ivany - a very gifted couple. Under the leadership of Major Bev, a large cast was assembled and a regular schedule of rehearsals was struck. The Ottawa Citadel "troup" presented five performances of *Spirit* in Ottawa and throughout the Division. It was a blessing for everyone who participated as well as those who attended the performances.

Although many of the songs were beautiful and/or uplifting, one that was especially inspirational was from Spirit – To Be Like Jesus. Here are the words:




