HAPPY MOTHER'S DAY!

Mothers of the Bible



"Mom, your strength, resilience, and unconditional love inspire me every day."

The Bible speaks highly of mothers who raise children and guide their families in a righteous manner; in the oft-quoted Proverbs 31, the **"wife of noble character"** is honored by her husband and children for her virtues.

1. **Mary, the Mother of Jesus** (Read John 19) Perhaps no more famous mother exists than Mary, who at a young age learned from an angel that she would give birth to the long-awaited Messiah. Her song of praise in response, and the well-known events of Christ's birth, are what usually spring to mind when we think of Mary (Luke 1:46-55). But her role as mother brought her grief as well as joy; one can only imagine what it must have been like for her to witness Jesus' crucifixion. **"Near the cross stood Mary, his mother."** (v25).

2. **Elizabeth** (Read Luke 1)

Elizabeth was a godly woman who was **"righteous in the sight of God, observing all the Lord's commands and decrees blamelessly"**—and yet she and her husband were unable to conceive a child. God answered her prayers late in her life and she gave birth to John the Baptist, but is perhaps best known for her prophetic encouragement of the young (and perhaps frightened) Mary: **"Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the child you will bear!"**

3. **Hannah (Read 1 Samuel 1)** (Continued from Page 1)
is one of the most inspiring mothers in the Bible, although her story is less well-known. Despite years of patience and prayer, she remained unable to have a child. One day *"in her deep anguish Hannah prayed to the LORD, weeping bitterly"*—and God answered her prayer at last. But Hannah's character truly shone when, in gratitude to God, she dedicated her newborn son to His service. Her son would one day become one of Israel's greatest prophets.
4. **Sarah, the Wife of Abraham (Read Genesis 18)**
Sarah is one of the great matriarchs of the Bible—yet she didn't become a mother until very late in life. In fact, her reaction to God's promise that she would have a son was to laugh, *"Then the LORD said to Abraham, 'Why did Sarah laugh and say, 'Will I really have a child, now that I am old?'"* Nevertheless, she did give birth to a son, and her lineage would include Jesus Christ himself.

Of course, there are many more famous mothers described in the Bible; many of them righteous, some not so much, but all used by God to bring about His purpose.

Let us give thanks for the mothers in our lives.


Seniors' Luncheon – March 20th



The leaders of both groups chose gorgeous musical selections featuring an Easter Theme.





Sharon Dean introduces the first set of Legacy Chorus selections.






B/M Geoff introduces the first set by the Legacy Brass: *This is My Father's World* and *The Old Rugged Cross*







Continuing Series – Salvation Army Song -Writers #7



Generals

As has been mentioned in previous editions of the *Ottawa Citadel Contact*, these two fine musicians are considered to be the key figures in establishing the “era of the musicals” beginning in 1967.

In the next few editions of the *Ottawa Citadel Contact*, we will conclude this series of articles about the ten full-length musicals created by these two remarkable Army leaders. In gathering information about the next two musicals written in 1975 and 1977, the editor ran into a bit of difficulty. While the musical, *Glory* was written in 1975 and widely acclaimed, summarizing it was a simple process. It was a much more challenging matter for the musical *White Rose*, written in 1977. Unfortunately, there are numerous other secular musicals of the same name written in the same era. The editor decided to stick with as reliable a description of The Salvation Army version of the musical as possible.

About the *Glory* Musical

Glory! is based on Edward Joy's classic book *The Old Corps* in which he writes about the Army's early days in Folkestone. The stories he tells about personalities he had known in his youth have become part of Salvation Army folklore. In the book a separate chapter is devoted to each of these characters, but in the musical we weave these stories together so that the personalities interact with each other before their individual stories resolve as the musical climaxes. In the way that *Glory!* blends drama and music together, it is probably the best crafted of our musicals.

About the *White Rose* Musical

The musical is set in Paris and tells the true story of how the gift of a white rose transformed a woman's life. Clare was in despair. Everything in life was going wrong for her. She then met some Salvationists who invited her to attend a meeting of the home league. At the end of the meeting the home league secretary had the inspiration of taking a white rose from the vase on the table and presenting it to Clare as a token of affection. When Clare took the white rose home its beauty and purity was in such a stark contrast to the neglected and run-down state of her home, that it eventually became the means of her conversion to Christ.

In consequence, the emblem of a white rose was for many years cherished by the home leagues in France as their signature emblem.

The musical was commissioned for the 70th anniversary of the home league, and its first performance was in the Royal Albert Hall, London, on 27 June 1977. It was later published by SP&S. It is the shortest of our musicals – perhaps a contributory reason for its widespread and continuing use not only by women's ministries throughout the Army world but also by other groups.

A Look Back at Ottawa Citadel's "Energizer Weekend"

September 29-30, 2012

To the credit of the leadership at Ottawa Citadel over the years, efforts have been made from time to time to support its leaders and to provide resources to assist those who had served as leaders as well as those considering or being considered for leadership roles. One such event was held in the early fall of 2012.

The training event was divided into two sections: Part 1 was identified as *Secrets of Leadership* and Part 2 as *An Examined Life*. This Bible-Based instructional event examined the leadership characteristics of Hezekiah. The Scripture references were as follows:





