## The Salvation Army and Prayer

For The Salvation Army, prayer is considered the foundational heartbeat of the movement, defined simply as an ongoing, extended conversation with God. Rooted in the belief that God listens to and answers every prayer, the organization provides widespread resources, global networks, and online portals to foster both personal and corporate worship. ### Core Beliefs and Practices

- **Simply Talking with God:** The Salvation Army teaches that there is no singular right or wrong way to pray; it is about approaching God honestly and consistently. [1]
- **Scriptural Foundation:** Their approach to prayer is heavily influenced by the Bible, specifically emphasizing passages like "pray without ceasing" (1 Thessalonians 5:17) and the Lord's Prayer. [1]
- **Diverse Prayer Styles:** They recognize that individuals connect with God differently. Whether someone prefers quiet reflection ("Sunbathers"), active engagement ("Surfers"), structured intercession ("Ice-cream sellers"), or deep scriptural study ("Snorkelers"), all styles are encouraged. [1]

### Global and Local Initiatives

- **International Headquarters:** The worldwide movement supports a dedicated  [Salvation Army International Prayer Focus](#) where individuals can submit prayer requests and participate in ongoing global intercessions. [1]
- **Local and Regional Resources:** Territories actively publish guides, such as the  [Salvation Army UKI Prayer Resources](#), which include year-long encounter encounters, fixed-hour prayer schedules, and daily challenges. [1, 2, 3]
- **Dedicated Publications:** Articles and reflections regarding faith are frequently featured in publications like  [The War Cry](#), encouraging believers to seek peace in God during difficult seasons. [1, 2]

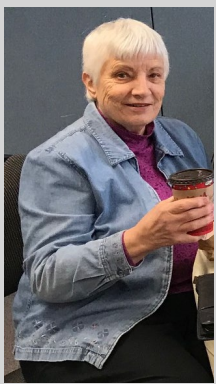

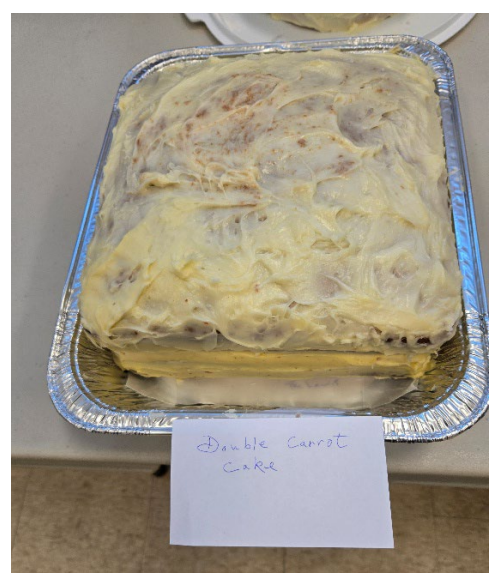

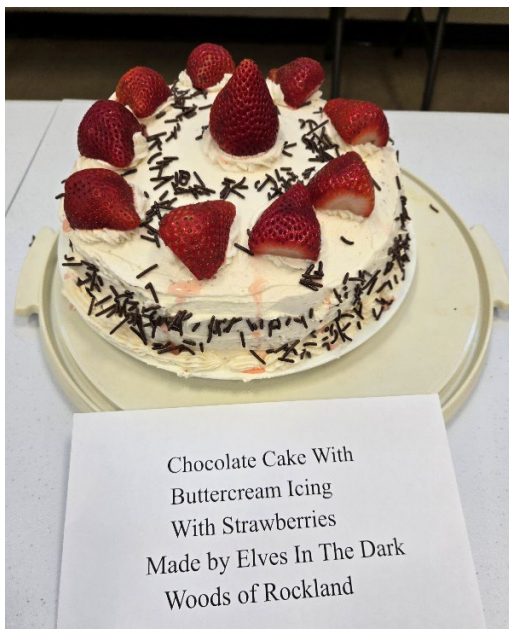
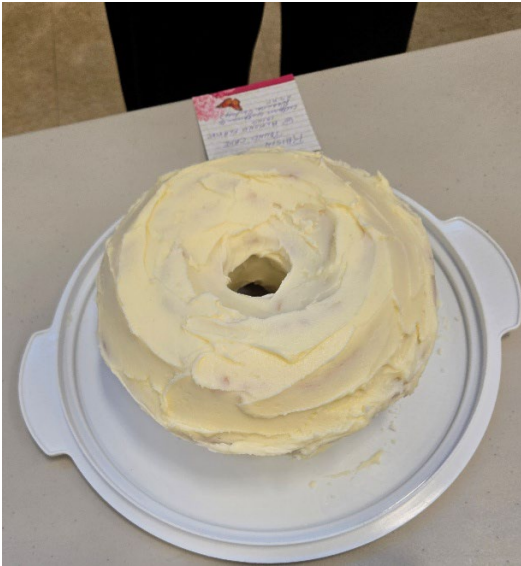

## Ottawa Citadel Building Advisory Committee - Meeting Notes

Thursday, 6 May 2026 at 10:00 AM  
1350 Walkley Road

**Participants:** Linda Colwell, Jim Ferguson, Dave Holland, David Lapp, Neil Lewis, Maj G Cory

1. The meeting was called to order at 10:00 AM. The participants did an external and internal walk around the building. Overall, the building and grounds are in good shape.
2. **Contractor Performance**  
On the snow front, we received good service over the winter and once the plow operator understood our plan for keeping as much snow away from the parking lot as possible, we were pretty good at retaining parking spots at least until close of the snow season. Because of the excess snowfall over the maximum covered by the contract, we received an end of season extra bill of well over \$1,200. The cost was competitive in the industry, and we really had little choice in the matter as we have to keep our parking lot clear.  
**Lawn Damage:** There was considerable damage to the grounds in the areas where the snow was piled. We are responsible for repairing that damage. Dave Holland was able to smooth the ruts, add topsoil and do the necessary reseeding.  
**The Grass Cutting** .The Frenik contract was been renewed and the workers have completed the initial clean up and parking lot sweeping.  
**The HVAC Units:** The contract with Atel was terminated early due to lack of performance. Prior to leaving our site, the company completed the relocation of the HVAC unit that had been incorrectly installed. The new contractor, Parent, has signed a one-year renewable contract to cover two major and two minor visits a year. The billing is on a quarterly basis. The initial visit provided good service, but the technician identified a number of deficiencies that will require follow up.
3. **External Sign:** The members reviewed the conceptual drawings and an initial estimate for replacing our external sign. This project will be costly - in excess of \$30K. Considerably more research remains to be done.
4. **Intruder and Fire Alarm System:** The current system is at least 26 years old, and parts are no longer available. We are pursuing quotes for a new combined intruder and fire alarm system which will include required annual maintenance and testing. CHUB Security will do a site visit and provide a quote on a replacement system and annual servicing.
5. **Officers' Quarters:** The Corys had planned to move to their new home in mid-May which provided lots of to do the minor maintenance and updates required before our new officer moves in. The installation of the new front door is a big improvement. It has resolved issues that have existed for quite some time.  
The remaining furniture will need to be disposed of prior to the new officer's arrival. Anything that the current Corps Officer does not want (most of the furniture) will be offered to Corps members on a first-come first-served basis.
6. **Next Meeting and Adjournment:** The next regular meeting will be called in the fall and will involve updating our new officer. The meeting was adjourned at 11:30 am.

Linda Colwell was appointed Grand Prior of the Order of St. George Canada on 25 April, 2026. Her leadership



as the Order enters its 700th year of international service and approaches its 25th anniversary in Canada. A career Air Force Logistics Officer, she served 36 years in the Canadian Armed Forces, retiring at the rank of Brigadier General. She continues her lifelong commitment to public service through her leadership of the Order and her ongoing roles with organizations such as the federal Pensioners’ Dental Service Plan Board of Directors, the Corps of Commissionaires, and the Friends of the Canadian War Museum. She is an Officer of the Order of Military Merit and holds a Bachelor of Science degree from Mount Allison University and an MBA from Western University.

## *Songs We Sing in The Salvation Army*



Song #197 in our Salvation Army Song Book, *I Know a Fount*, is a powerful statement of faith and expression of the Christian experience set to a beautiful melody – both by Oliver Cooke in 1925. This combination of words and melody have been revisited numerous times through the intervening years with deeply moving new settings for both Band and Songster selections. The quality of the musical groups performing this music has further highlighted the majesty of *I Know a Fount*, where sins are washed away...

Oliver Cooke was born in Berkshire, England in 1873, as the son of a farm laborer. When his family moved to London, Oliver was able to study music at the London College of Music and earned a certificate in organ playing. At the Salvation Army, he learned to play a cornet, and later became first a bandmaster and then a songster leader. He had his first song published in *The War Cry* in 1888 and for the next 50 years he continued writing songs for *The Musical Salvationist*, a publication for songster brigades (choirs). Cooke was Promoted to Glory in 1945. *(Heather Allington, The Salvation Army, Oshawa)*

## A NEW SERIES

*The Salvation Army – Who Are We?*

As the decades pass, in many area of our lives, understanding of trends and accurate memories of who stands for what has become somewhat blurred. The editor of the *Contact* felt that this was true of some of the standards and beliefs of our own Salvation Army. In this mini-series, the editor turned to an unusual source of facts and figures – Wikipedia on The Salvation Army. Readers may be surprised at some of the information garnered by the researchers at Wikipedia in counsel with Salvation Army personnel. Your feedback on the basis for this series will be gratefully received.

**The Salvation Army, an international movement, is an evangelical part of the universal Christian church. Its message is based on the Bible. Its ministry is motivated by the love of God. Its mission is to preach the gospel of Jesus Christ and to meet human needs in His name without discrimination.**<sup>[24]</sup>

Early beliefs of the Salvation Army were influenced by the book *Helps to Holiness*,<sup>[25]</sup> which influenced spiritual life in the Army for a generation.<sup>[1]:57</sup> The [sacred text](#) of the Salvation Army is the [\(protestant\) Bible](#),<sup>[26]</sup> and the beliefs of the Salvation Army rest upon eleven doctrines:<sup>[27]</sup>

1. We believe that the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments were given by inspiration of God; and that they only constitute the Divine rule of Christian faith and practice.
2. We believe that there is only one God, who is infinitely perfect, the Creator, Preserver, and Governor of all things, and who is the only proper object of religious worship.
3. We believe that there are three persons in the Godhead – the Father, the Son and the Holy Ghost – undivided in essence and co-equal in power and glory.
4. We believe that in the person of Jesus Christ, the Divine and human natures are united, so that He is truly and properly God and truly and properly man.
5. We believe that our first parents were created in a state of innocence, but by their disobedience, they lost their purity and happiness; and that in consequence of their fall all men have become sinners, totally depraved, and as such are justly exposed to the wrath of God.
6. We believe that the Lord Jesus Christ has, by His suffering and death, made an atonement for the whole world so that whosoever believes in him will not perish but have eternal life.
7. We believe that repentance towards God, faith in our Lord Jesus Christ and regeneration by the Holy Spirit are necessary to salvation.
8. We believe that we are justified by grace, through faith in our Lord Jesus Christ; and that he that believeth hath the witness in himself.
9. We believe that continuance in a state of salvation depends upon continued obedient faith in Christ.
10. We believe that it is the privilege of all believers to be wholly sanctified, and that their whole spirit and soul and body may be preserved blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.
11. We believe in the immortality of the soul; in the resurrection of the body; in the general judgment at the end of the world; in the eternal happiness of the righteous; and in the endless punishment of the wicked.

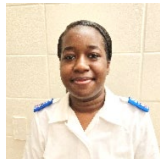

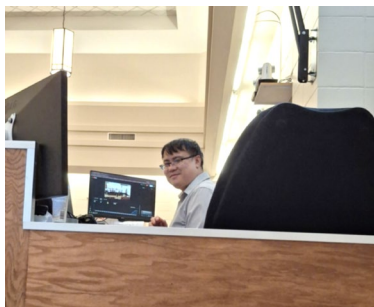

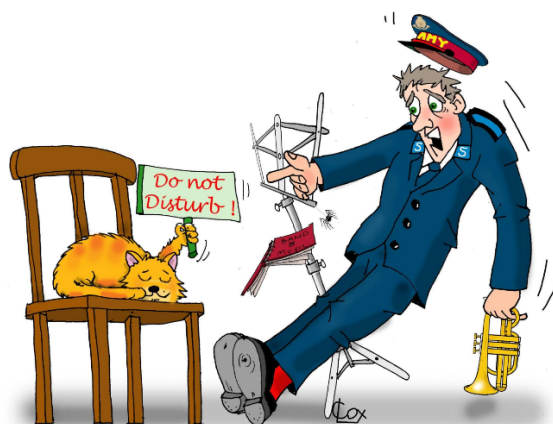
